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The Hispanic-Serving health Professions Schools (HSHPS) is a non-profit organization established in 1996 in response to the President's Executive Order 12900, "*Educational Excellence for Hispanic Americans.*" The Association was established with support from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services as part of the DHHS "*Hispanic Agenda for Action Initiative.*" HSHPS currently represents 24 medical schools and two schools of public health.

The principle goals of the Association are as follows:

- 1) To strengthen the nation's capacity to educate and increase the numbers of high-quality Hispanic health care providers to serve and improve the health status of Hispanics and other populations now and into the 21st century;
- 2) To develop educational opportunities in health professions schools in curriculum, research and clinical experiences that will enable Hispanic and non-Hispanic health professions students to provide excellent health care to Hispanic populations;
- 3) To establish or expand outreach projects, grants and scholarships for Hispanics to enter health professions careers;
- 4) To stimulate health professions institutions to increase, promote and retain Hispanic faculty and researchers;
- 5) To identify targeted health outcomes which will improve the health of Hispanic populations and support health policy, systems of care, and projects which will help to achieve these outcomes; and
- 6) To promote collaboration at the regional and national levels between educational institutions, communities and other partners.
